BACKGROUND | AB 2722

Created the Transformative Climate Community Program, to be administered by the Strategic Growth Council, to "fund the development and implementation of neighborhood-level transformative climate community plans that include multiple, coordinated greenhouse gas emissions reduction projects that provide local economic, environmental, and health benefits to disadvantaged communities, as described in Section 39711 of the Health and Safety Code." (Pub. Resources Code § 75240.)






5 TRANSFORMATIVE REQUIREMENTS

ELIGIBLE PROJECT TYPES

- California Climate Investment (CCI) Eligible
- Project Types and components <u>not</u> included in CCI programs must use leveraged funding

- Identify: Goals, Strategies, Project Types
- Work plan Summary and Budget



FULL APPLICATION + SCORING

- Narrative
- Estimate GHG Emissions Reductions
- Detailed Work Plan and Budget
- Transformative Plans
- Commitment of Leveraged Funds



FULL APPLICATION + SCORING

- Initial Assessment by Interagency Panel
 - Integration Objective, Strategies, Project Types
 - Capacity
 - Integration Transformative Requirements
- Site Visits
- Recommendations
- Posted 10 days prior to SGC public meeting



PLANNING GRANTS



PLANNING GRANTS OVERVIEW

- Up to \$1.5 million in planning grants to be awarded
- Individual grants of up to \$250,000
- Approximately 1 year grant term
- Goal

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• Increase ability to successfully apply for future rounds of TCC or other California Climate Investment Programs



FOCUS OF PLANNING ACTIVITIES

- Respond planning issues benefit vulnerable communities
- Defined in existing regional or local plan
- Further develop an area to be eligible for future TCC Implementation Grant



APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY

- Cities
- Counties
- Metropolitan planning organizations
- Joint powers authorities
- Regional transportation planning agencies
- Councils of government
- Combinations of jurisdictions



REQUIREMENTS

• At least 2 joint Partners

• Priority for strong and diverse partnerships

• Define Planning Area Census Tracts top 25% CES 3.0

 \odot Incorporated cities and unincorporated areas Eligible

• Consistency with local and regional plans



PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- Promote TCC Program Primary Objectives
- Promote SGC Sustainable Communities Objectives
- Prepare applicants to meet the Implementation Grant Transformative Requirements
- Consistency with State Planning Priorities

- Online Submittal: FAAST
- Proposed budget and timeline of activities
- Work Plan

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• Letters of Support



SCORING CRITERIA

• Extent to which proposed planning activities accomplish:

 \circ Plan Objectives

- Meet Strategic Growth Council Objectives
- Satisfy State planning priorities
- Increase ability to apply for Implementation Grant
