Fresno Transformative Climate Communities Collaborative Community Steering Committee: Rules for Attendance, Speaking and Voting

Meeting Attendance

Meetings are open to anyone interested in attending.

Speaking

Everyone has equal right to speak at the meetings, following the established agenda and time limits.

Voting Membership

To become a voting member of the Community Steering Committee (CSC), an attendee must:

- 1) Live, work or own a business or property in the project focus area, defined at ZIP Codes 93706 and 93721.
- 2) Meet the following standards of consistent attendance:
 - Residents must attend 50% of the CSC meetings to maintain voting status
 - Workers and owners of businesses and property must attend 66% of the CSC meetings to maintain voting status. "Work" is defined as at least half of working hours in the defined project area.

The chart below shows you how many meeting you have to attend to be eligible to vote at each Community Steering Committee meeting.

Example: To vote at CSC Meeting #4, a resident would have to have attended 2 total meetings, including that night. To vote at the same meeting, a worker, business or property owner would have to have attended 3 meetings, including that night.
